## THE SURPRISES OF THE RISEN JESUS

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER Year B

Journalist and story-teller, Sara Maitland, writing in last week's London Tablet, tells the story of a time she was watching the movie "Four Weddings and a Funeral" with a little old nun.

She recalls: "At one point in the film, Scarlett (played by Charlotte Coleman), dressed in men's formal wedding clothes, precipitates herself at full speed into the arms of Chester, (Randall Paul), wrapping her arms around his neck and her legs round his waist. I heard Sister gasp, and when I asked her what it was, she said, "That's exactly what I've always imagined Mary Magdalene doing in the Resurrection garden."

Artists have always portrayed this scene from the gospel in more restrained ways than the way our nun imagined it. Most of us probably wouldn't have dared to think of it all happening quite this way until an old nun alerts us to the possibility.

The stories around Jesus are full of passionate hints. We have babies leaping in wombs, blind people singing and praising God in front of the whole neighbourhood as their sight returns, a wedding group partying like there was no tomorrow with six thirty-gallon jars of fresh wine to get through!

Once Jesus is risen, the stories are full of quaint details, the number of fish the disciples catch when they see Jesus on the shore, the exact placement of the binding cloths in the tomb and so on. On the road too Emmaus, the disciples' hearts are burning within them and minds are racing, trying to make sense of what it is, who it is, that they are experiencing. The infant Church is born and is built around this experience of the Risen Jesus. It is this level of surprising presence that stirs something in them that is at the core of our faith today.

However, we've all grown up having heard how the story ends, so it's possible that we encounter the Easter stories with a certain familiarity and with little or no sense of surprise. In this mode, nothing leaps, nothing sings, nothing surprises, and we already know where to find plenty of wine when we need it!

Just relying on these well-worn stories doesn't always do the trick.

Then we hear of a baby born a month prematurely whose parents are beside themselves with joy following the mother's pre-natal month-long hospital confinement. We experience a funeral celebration in which a beautiful life is unpacked in front of us, a life full of faith, imagination, passion, humour and love that we hadn't, been able to glimpse in the failing body of an aged parishioner.

We meet a little girl battling long-term cancer, and now approaching months of painful and life-threatening bone surgery, whose spirit is as bright as any other three-year-old. Alongside her are parents and grandparents, filled with love for this frail child and heroic in their attention and care.

There's a widowed lady not far away who is allowing herself to come back to a zest for life following the death of her husband. She grieves still the ending of 60-plus years of marriage, and delights in her ability to enjoy the simple pleasures that are still within her reach.

Every day we can encounter evidence of the Risen Jesus in such a way that our hearts are stirred and our minds alerted as we, like the first disciples, discover the surprising grace, courage and beauty that is so near at hand. Let's be on the lookout for Jesus as he rises in surprisingly familiar places. Like the early disciples, let's tell each other the stories of how we have glimpsed him risen and new.

Inspired by such encounters, may we allow our hearts to leap, to burn, to dance, knowing that our own rising from the dead is already in progress.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.'
